Children can read quietly in the reading area if they find the tasks set too challenging. We encourage pupils to take their morning activity worksheet home to finish each day.

Please continue to encourage your child to be independent when they start school, putting their coat on their peg, their book bag in the box and their water bottle by the sink.

Our Circus Topic:

This term, the children will be learning about the Circus. We will be writing invitations to invite parents to our show which we will hold on the last week of Term. We would like the children to post these invitations to you. Please can you send in a stamped addressed envelope (it doesn't need to be bigger than A5 size). More details about the show will follow.

The children are going to be planting during Science lessons this term. We would appreciate clean jam jars to help with this project. Please send any jars and the stamped addressed envelope into school in the first week back after the Christmas holiday. Thank you.

Reading:

Your child has been given a book from the school library to read with you. Please help your child to change their book in the Infant library. There is a box in the library for returned books. Follow the colours which are used to identify the books which are at the appropriate level to your child's reading. We do ask that you listen to your child read daily - and do also read to your child as well and ask the questions given at the Parent Teacher Interviews. Please write in the reading record. Your child will take part in guided reading sessions in class.
