Dear Parents,

I hope you've had a good holiday and the weather hasn't thwarted too many plans. This term we have the task of covering 70,000 years of history, as we travel back to Palaeolithic times and explore the journey of humans from the Stone Age to the Bronze Age. The children will learn about the lives of early people: the skills they perfected, the challenges they faced and the animals that roamed with them before discovering the move to the use of metal and other new ways of living in Bronze Age cultures.

We have two great stories to accompany our work - 'The Stone Age Boy' and the classic 'Stig of the Dump'. The children will be working on writing to entertain with stories and descriptions of Stone Age life, kenning poetry and diary entries. Towards the end of the term the children will be reporting on the now extinct beasts that roamed the earth in our early history.

In Science, we cover rocks and fossils, while in art we will be creating cave paintings and clay pottery based on that found at Skara Brae in Scotland. In DT we will be designing and constructing a Stone Age to Bronze Age Village.

Forest school will allow for the children to hone their hunter gatherer skills: starting fire with flint, learning about the different trees and their uses, flint knapping and creating camps. This will continue on Thursday afternoons.

PE will be on Monday and Friday, when we will be taking advantage of the good weather we are due and playing tennis and rounders.

We also have an exciting start to the topic with a drama company coming in to bring the topic to life with a 'Savage Stone Age' day. One Day Creative will be leading the children in a fun and engaging workshop which will result in a short performance at the end of the day showing off all they have learnt. They are due to be into school on Wednesday, April 25th and you are welcome to join us for a final performance from 2:30pm. There is a cost for the day, which has been considerably subsidised by the PTFA, who have reduced it from £11 to £6.30. This can be paid on ParentPay. We are looking forward to an exciting day!
